| <p><b>Bus or Limousine Operations:</b> All employees.</p> <p>This classification applies to transportation services provided to passengers on a scheduled route or charter basis using vehicles that include but are not limited to buses, vans, and limousines.</p> <p>This classification also applies to paratransit services for elderly or disabled individuals who do not require medical supervision while in transit.</p> <p>Transportation services provided with medical supervision shall be classified as 7332, Ambulance Services.</p> | 7382 | \$7.42   | \$6.70   | -10%       |

This classification includes but is not limited to resident or on-site property managers and property maintenance or repair staff.</p> <p>On-site property managers are those employees whose base of operations is at any property location that they are employed to manage.
