# **Valley Fever**

People who work outdoors in California's Central Valley and other locations, especially workers who dig or disturb soil, are at risk for Valley fever. The new California law, AB 203, requires construction employers in endemic counties provide Valley fever training to their employees. The training will cover Valley fever basics and ways to minimize exposures.
