Preventing Sidewalk Trips and Falls

This training will cover issues related to sidewalk trips and falls, including:

- Government code requirements to establish a dangerous condition of public property - and the potential defenses and immunities to protect public entities
- Concepts of actual and constructive notice. Adjacent property owner's duty to repair city sidewalks according to the Streets and Highway Code and applicable local ordinances
- Update on the "Gonzales v. City of San Jose" - type ordinance that shifts some, but not all, liability for injuries of third parties to adjacent property owners and their insurance carriers
- Relevant legislation and case law
- Proper sidewalk claim documentation
- Sidewalk repair processes, including patching, grinding, and saw cutting. A demonstration of sidewalk cutting will be conducted
