Confined Space Entry / Non-Entry Rescue

Police Pursuit Immunity

One of the essential functions of law enforcement is to pursue and apprehend criminals. Unfortunately, vehicle pursuits are inherently dangerous, and public entities can end up bearing the burden of expensive lawsuits related to death or injuries caused by vehicle pursuits. In an effort to promote safe vehicle pursuits, the Legislature enacted Vehicle Code section 17004.7, which provides public agencies with immunity if the agency adopts, promulgates and trains on an appropriate vehicle pursuit policy. This presentation will detail and discuss how public agencies can ensure and establish compliance with the procedural requirements of the Vehicle Pursuit Immunity, such as the requirements of the vehicle pursuit policy, how to promulgate the policy and how to train on the policy. The session will also discuss how to maintain records and assist legal counsel in preparation of motions to establish the immunity defense before trial. Classes will be held in person 9:00-10:30.



Post Certified Law Enforcement Forum/Social Media Misconduct & Legal Update

Social Media Misconduct Update (2 hours CPT)

Under recent legislation, did you know the authority of a Chief or Sheriff to impose discipline less than **termination** is not allowed if one is engaged in specific social media content? In response to the unprecedented level of terminations of peace officers, including chiefs and sheriffs for social media misconduct, this is the first and primary POST-certified course that examines the growing and uncontrolled enormity of the negative societal and law enforcement impacts of social media misconduct by peace officers. The training will address the consequences of social media interactions, whether on or off-duty. The instructor will offer numerous real-life examples of California peace officers terminated for this behavior, which is the leading cause of all discipline combined. Training will address important legal updates.

LEGAL UPDATE (2 hours CPT)

This training will address current legal updates related to search & seizure, liability issues, use of force "Hot Button" topics, non-response to suicide calls, and SB 2.

Use of Force: This segment will address current use of force "Hot Button" legal and policy issues, including criminal prosecutions of officers.

Non-Response to Suicide Calls: *Why are we still responding to these calls?* Law enforcement has repeatedly been penalized with significant financial liability for use of force against suicidal subjects. The instructor developed the state's first law enforcement non-response protocol to suicide calls. This protocol has been adopted by California and other state law enforcement agencies. Training will address these protocols as well as the applicable legal cases and the speaker's investigations related to
